Training Elements

The GA training program includes **high-impact practices** such as reflection and active learning. Training includes:

- Reference interviews
- Teaching observation
- Co-teaching
- Canvas LMS online training
- Homework
- GA-led brown-bag discussions
- Teaching and reference templates and best practices
- Culminating teaching portfolio
